# **APRSAF-17 POSTER CONTEST**

On the occasion of the 17th session of Asia-Pacific Regional Space Agency Forum<sup>1</sup> (APRSAF-17), to be co-organized by the Department of Innovation, Industry, Science and Research (DIISR) and Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA)<sup>2</sup> from 23 to 26 November 2010 in Melbourne, Australia, there will be a Poster Contest for children in this region, to encourage them to explore their creativity, expand their imaginations and express their dreams of discovering the unknowns of the universe.

# **Objectives:**

- \* To enhance children's interest in and awareness of space science and technology; and
- \* To encourage them to expand their imagination about the universe



Theme: "Space technology to Help the Earth"

- \*This Poster Contest encourages children to expand their imagination and explore how space technology helps us every day. It also contributes to the celebration of the International Year of Biodiversity in 2010.

## **Drawing / Painting Rules:**

- \* Drawing / painting should be made on paper of A3 size (297 x420 mm) at minimum and A2 size (420x594 mm) at maximum.
- \* Means of drawing / painting are free: pencil, crayon, water color, oil painting, computer drawing, etc. However, photos are not accepted.
- \* The drawing / painting must not include words or slogans must not represent any particular individual, organization, or brand name.
- \* Each drawing / painting must have the name of the participant(s) and his/her/their country in English on the back side.

#### General Rules:

- \* The contest is open for participation by children in Asia-Pacific region at the age from 8 up to 11 years old.
- \*A poster can be submitted by either a single student or a group of up to two students.
- \* Each country should select three (3) best posters and submit them to the local organizer along with the completed entry form, which is available from the Secretariat of APRSAF Space Education and Awareness Working Group.
- \* The digital copies of the selected posters, in "jpg" files, and a copy of the completed entry form must be submitted to the Secretariat of APRSAF Space Education and Awareness Working Group at the following e-mail address, <a href="mailto:aprsaf17posters@edu.jaxa.jp">aprsaf17posters@edu.jaxa.jp</a>. Each file should contain the digital copy of only one poster, and the size of each file should not exceed 2 MB.

#### Deadline:

The <u>digital copies</u> of the selected posters must reach the Secretariat of APRSAF Space Education and Awareness Working Group by <u>Friday</u>, <u>15</u> <u>October 2010</u>. The <u>originals</u> of the posters must reach the Local Organizer by <u>Friday</u>, <u>29 October 2010</u>.

## **Selection of award winners:**

All members of APRSAF Space Education and Awareness Working Group as well as registered participants of APRSAF-17 will be invited to participate in the selection of award winners by casting one vote per person either on-line prior to APRSAF-17 or on site during APRSAF-17. Details of the voting will be communicated to the Working Group members and the participants of APRSAF-17 in due course. "APRSAF Best Poster Award" will be given to the poster that receives the most votes, and "Special APRSAF Poster Award" will be given to those that receive the second and third most votes. The final voting results will be reviewed by the Working Group and will be announced during APRSAF-17.
